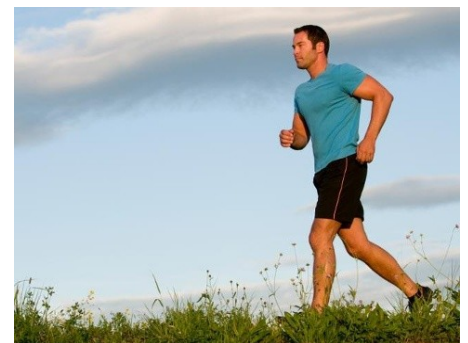
### Get Moving
