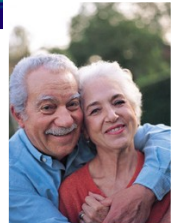

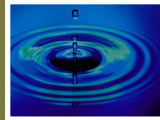

Drug Testing

- Five- and Nine-Panel Urine Drug Testing
Urine testing, one of the most common screening methods, is an accurate and reliable way to detect casual drug use that occurred within the past 72 hours.
- Hair Testing
Hair testing for drugs of abuse is the only drug-testing method available that provides up to a 90-day drug use history.
