BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Breast cancer awareness statistics:

- **Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer among American women.**
- **Black women are most likely to die from breast cancer than women of any other racial or ethnic group.**
- **About 85% of breast cancers occur in women who have no family history of breast cancer. These occur due to genetic mutations that happen as a result of the aging process and life in general.**

Risk Factors and screenings:

Just being a woman and growing older are the two biggest risk factors for breast cancer. Those factors are difficult to change, but you can change other risk factors, such as smoking, drinking alcohol, and not exercising regularly.

Regular breast self-exams, an annual exam by your doctor, and yearly mammograms are important tools in breast cancer detection - especially early detection, when cancers may be more treatable.

Things to do this breast cancer awareness month

- **Monthly self breast exams**
- **If you are over 40 or have other risk factors for breast cancer, schedule your annual mammogram appointment.**
