In 2024, more than 360,000 people will be diagnosed with breast cancer. But there is hope. Advancements in early detection methods and support continue to increase the chances of survival. When caught in its earliest, localized stages, the 5-year relative survival rate of breast cancer is 99%.

Breast cancer screening means checking a woman's breasts for cancer before there are signs or symptoms of the disease. Your health care provider can tell you about the best screening options for you. When you are told about the benefits and risks of screening and decide with your health care provider whether screening is right for you - and if so, when to have it - this is called informed and shared decision-making.

The US Preventive Services Task Force recommends that women who are 40 to 74 years old and are at average risk for breast cancer get a mammogram every 2 years. Women should weigh the benefits and risks of screening tests. Different screening recommendations may be used for women at higher than average risk.

A mammogram is an x-ray of the breast. For many women, mammograms are the best way to find breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat. Regular mammograms can find breast cancer early, sometimes up to 3 years before it can be felt. Having regular mammograms can lower the risk of dying from breast cancer. At this time, a mammogram is the best way to find breast cancer for most women of screening age.

A breast MRI uses magnets and radio waves to take pictures of the breast. Breast MRI is used along with mammograms to screen women who are at high risk for getting breast cancer.

Clinical breast is an examination by a doctor or nurse. Breast self-awareness of how your breast look and feel can help you notice symptoms such as lumps, pain, or changes in size that may be of concern.

The benefit of screening is finding cancer early, when it's easier to treat. Talk to your health care provider about when and what type of screening is right for you.
