August is National Immunization Awareness Month (NIAM). This annual observance highlights the importance of getting recommended vaccines throughout your life. During NIAM, the National Health Council (NHC), along

with our members, encourage you to talk to your doctor, nurse, or other health care professional to ensure you and your family are protected against serious diseases by getting caught up on routine vaccinations.

With the new school year about to start — and flu season right around the corner — it's a great time to remind people in our community that getting all recommended vaccines protects against serious illness.

Childhood vaccines or immunizations can seem overwhelming when you are a new parent.

Vaccinations not only protect your child from deadly

diseases, they also keep other children safe by eliminating or greatly decreasing dangerous diseases.



A vaccine is a dead or weakened version or part of the germ that causes the disease in question. When children are exposed to a disease in vaccine form, their immune system, which is the body's germ-fighting machine, is able to build up antibodies that protect them from contracting the disease if and when they are

Vaccines work by stimulating the body's immune system to safely provide protection against viruses or bacteria that cause infection. After vaccination, the immune system is prepared to respond quickly when the body encounters the disease-causing organism.

Why are vaccines important? They help provide protection from an infectious disease and can lessen the severity of illness. If you are immune to a disease, you can be exposed to it without becoming sick. Simply put, because of advances in medical science, vaccines can help protect us against more diseases than ever before. Some diseases that once injured or killed thousands of people have been eliminated primarily due to vaccines.

We all have a public health obligation to our communities to protect ourselves as well as others from potential health risks. By getting vaccinated, we eliminate diseases before they have a chance to spread.
