The Mission of the Marion County Health Department is to improve the quality of life through preventing disease and preventative health maintenance.

Crohn's and Colitis Awareness Week, which runs from December 1 to December 7 each year, aims to educate people about the symptoms, causes, and ways to manage Crohn's disease and colitis. The main reason for raising awareness is because the symptoms are quite common and are easily confused with other diseases and medical problems, resulting in people not receiving the right medical treatment in time. Those afflicted face many problems relating to the gastrointestinal tract, which reduces their physical activity and overall quality of life.

The disease is named after Dr. Burrill B. Crohn, who published a landmark paper with collegues Drs. Gordon Oppenheimer and Leon Ginzburg in 1932 that described what is known today as Crohn's disease.

Crohn's disease (CD) belongs to a group of conditions known as inflammatory bowel diseases (IBD). Crohn's disease is a chronic inflammatory condition of the gastrointestinal tract.



Symptoms include diarrhea (sometimes bloody), as well as crampy abdominal pain, nausea, fever, anemia, loss of appetite, weight loss, fatigue (tired, exhausted feeling), and at times, rectal bleeding. When you have Crohn's you will not have the same symptoms all the time. In fact, sometimes you may have no symptoms at all, this is called clinical remission.

Crohn's disease is not the same thing as ulcerative colitis, another type of IBD. The symptoms of the two illnesses are quite similar, but the areas affected in your body are different. Crohn's disease may affect any part of the gastronintestinal (GI) tract, from the mouth to the anus, but ulcerative colitis is limited to the colon - also the large intestine. CD most commonly affects the end of the small bowel (the ileum) and the beginning of the colon. Crohn's disease can also affect the entire thickness of the bowel wall, while ulcerative colitis only involves the innermost lining of the colon. Finally, in Crohn's disease, the inflammation of the intestine can "skip" leaving normal areas in between patches of diseased intestine.

Making the Diagnosis
Since a number of other
conditions can produce the
same symptoms as Crohn's
disease, your Doctor relies on
various medical tests to rule out
other potential causes for your
symptoms, such as infection.
Tests may include:

- Stool tests
- Bowel Imaging
- Blood Tests
- Colonoscopy and upper endoscopy

There are very effective treatments available that may control your Crohn's disease and even place it into clinical remission. The best way to control Crohn's disease is by taking medications as prescribed by your doctor or other healthcare professional. Paying attention to your diet and nutrition might help you reduce symptoms, replace lost nutrients, and promote healing. It is important for Crohn's disease patients to continue general health maintenance. While working with your gastroenterologist, also remember to speak with your primary care provider about other important issues, including vaccinations, oral health, vision, heart, breast and prostate screening, and periodic blood testing.
