

Awareness of the facts and statistics surrounding breast cancer in the United States is key in empowering individuals to make informed decisions about their health.

The early detection of breast cancer through annual mammography and other breast exams is the best defense against receiving a late-stage breast cancer diagnosis. Generally speaking, the earlier the cancer is detected, the greater the likelihood of a successful outcome.



In 2026, an estimated 382,640 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer, including 321,910 with invasive breast cancer and 60,730 with non-invasive (in situ) breast cancer.

There are currently over 4 million breast cancer survivors in the United States.

An estimated 168,000 breast cancer survivors in the U.S. are living with Stage 4 metastatic breast cancer.

An estimated 42,140 U.S. women will die from breast cancer in 2026.

Risk of breast cancer recurrence depends on the type and staging of the initial breast cancer. Typically, the highest risk of recurrence is during the first few years after treatment and decreases over time.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer in American women, except for skin cancers.

Approximately 30% of all new female cancer diagnoses will be breast cancer.

On average, every 2 minutes a woman is diagnosed with breast cancer in the United States.

1 in 8 women, or approximately 13% of the female population in the U.S., will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Approximately 66% of breast cancer cases are diagnosed at a localized stage, before cancer has spread outside of the breast, when it is easiest to treat.

The 5-year relative survival rate for early-stage cancer diagnosed at the localized stage is over 99%.

Approximately 10-15% of women diagnosed have a family history of breast cancer. Those with a first-degree relative (mother, sister, daughter) with breast cancer are nearly twice as likely to develop breast cancer themselves.

Half of U.S. women who develop breast cancer are 62 years of age or younger when they are diagnosed.

About 10% of all new breast cancer cases in the U.S. are diagnosed in women younger than 45 years old.

Younger people, particularly those under age 35 at the time of their original breast cancer diagnosis, face a higher risk of breast cancer recurrence.

All people are born with some breast cells and tissue, including men. Although rare, men get breast cancer too.

The lifetime risk of a U.S. man developing breast cancer is about 1 in 755.

In 2026, an estimated 2,670 men will be diagnosed with invasive breast cancer in the U.S.

An estimated 530 U.S. men will die from breast cancer in 2026.

Black men have the highest male breast cancer incidence and mortality rate.

Breast cancer death rates have slowly decreased over time, for an overall decline of 44% since 1989. This is in part due to better screening and early detection efforts, increased awareness, and continually improving treatment options.

Women who receive regular screening for breast cancer have a 26% lower breast cancer death rate than women who do not receive screenings.

It is important to keep in mind that survival rates cannot predict what will happen in anyone's specific case. Always talk to your doctor about how survival rates may apply to your specific situation and case.
